

A Word from Roger: Suggestions For Being Emotionally Available To Children and Grandchildren

- 1. Be emotionally available to care for them so they feel free to share their thoughts, feelings, heartaches, disappointments without being invalidated.
- 2. Take time for them, and look for ways to be involved in their lives. Two key questions to sincerely ask are: How can I help? and How can I be praying for you? These questions open doors for communication, without pressuring them. When they share how we could help, we need to be prepared (if it is within our ability) to help in practical ways.
- 3. Communicate with them but do not monopolize the conversation or shut it down by being to expressive. If they are adults, speak adult to adult and not like a parent talking down to a child. Our communication must include listening and really understanding what they have to say (even if we do not agree) and treating them with respect. Convey that we are truly interested in them and what is happening in their lives.
