Dear Prayer Partners,

Have you thought about the ripple affect your life has on others when you choose to follow the Lord Jesus? One day Jesus saw two brothers, casting a fishing net into the sea trying to catch fish. Jesus said, "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Matt. 4:19) They had no idea how the Lord would unfold the future and use their obedience. They just followed and Peter and Andrew were used to bring many people to the Lord Jesus.

Evangelism involves catching the fish (bringing people to Christ). However, that work continues through discipleship which involves cleaning the fish. The Lord isn't just satisfied with people being saved. He wants those who are saved to be set apart and become obedient followers through whom He can work to bring others to Himself.

At Restoration Ministries much of what we do involves cleaning the fish. As people experience the Lord's power in setting them free from the strongholds of sin and the control of negative emotions, flowing from their wounded hearts, they become part of the discipleship process in ministering to and loving others starting with their own spouse and family. A recent letter from one of our alumni who experienced the Lord's healing of her heart and marriage (over 6 yrs. ago) is a vivid reminder of this principle. She says, "I was sitting in church a couple of weeks ago and looking around at all the couples you and Brenda have helped just within my church and community. When my husband and I were going through our struggle, I wondered why it was happening. I don't know that my parents would still be together had they not come to you. They came because I didn't give them a choice because of what I experienced! Just want to say THANKS for being willing to follow where God has led you!"

We want to encourage you to take steps of faith and follow the Lord and watch how God unfolds the future. Thanks for being a part of "cleaning fish".

A Word from Roger: Suggestions For Being Emotionally Available To Children and Grandchildren

(Continued from our February newsletter)

- 7. Affirm and consistently praise them. There are always negative things that can be pointed out. There is a right way and time to do this; however, everyone needs encouragement and affirmation. Find positive things to affirm or to express appreciation for. Express affirmation to their parents as you see them doing a good job in parenting. Do not go to their games or activities and then later talk about what a good athlete, musician, etc. their classmate is, but neglect to affirm our children or grandchildren first.
- 8. Understand and discern their love language. There are 5 ways that people speak the language of love (Acts of Service, Physical Touch and Closeness, Gift Giving, Quality Time, Words of Encouragement). People will have one or two primary love languages out of which they show love. They will feel loved as love is communicated in their love language.
- 9. Make more deposits into your relationship account than withdrawals. There are times in every relationship when a withdrawal takes place due to a failure or fault.



However if we are making consistent "love deposits" in the account we will not find the relationship overdrawn when there is an occasional withdrawal.
