I get weekly calls from couples whose marriages are in trouble and are seeking help. What can local churches do to help couples like this? How can we help couples, who get help, continue to make progress in their marriages?


There are many excellent resources and ministries designed to strengthen marriages and families. However, I would like to take the next few segments in our ministry updates to share with you how each of you who are growing in your marriage can be a blessing to other couples by being willing to mentor a married couple.

The dictionary defines a "mentor" as "a wise trusted teacher or guide". This simple definition also describes a life coach or a discipler of others. There are **two mental road blocks** that prevent people from being a mentor that provides encouragement and spiritual care or counsel to others.

- \* "Who am I to mentor others because I have so many problems myself?"
- \* The second obstacle is, "I don't know what to say."

You may believe that since you haven't completely worked through all your own personal problems in living you are not qualified to help others. This is like stating that a medical doctor must always be well and never get sick in order to medically treat others. **The good news is that having a problem and working on it is the first quality God is looking for in a Biblical mentor.** We see this illustrated in the lives of men and women of faith in the Bible. They were in a **process** of growing and God used them and worked through them in spite of their struggles.

## Report From The Philippines:

We have had the privilege of partnering with the Gastons since 2008, helping to equip them with materials, resources, prayer and encouragement. God recently provided a computer for them through Restoration Ministries.

Here are highlights from a recent report from them:

- Teaching basic counseling skills classes in Burma
- Conducting a marriage enrichment seminar among tribal pastors and workers in northeast India.
- Working on translating the 6-book series of "Equip to Serve" discipleship materials.
- The lay counselors' mentoring class resumed with 12 in training.
- Helping a continuous flow of counselees.
- Holding a marriage enrichment retreat with 20 couples. Most talked about issues in their marriage for the first time.

• Speaking at a young professionals retreat with the theme "Breaking Through the Barriers in Pursuing Holiness."

◆ May 26-June 9 - Traveling to two Asian countries for a counseling summit, training more tribal pastors and workers in marriage counseling.

The Gastons also ask for prayer and wisdom on whether to extend their ministry to having a radio program with the theme "Counseling School On the Air". Many want to be trained but are limited because of time and finances. The offer came when they are swamped with invitations from different churches for counseling training. If this is God's will, the local radio station wants to start in July. There is also the possibility of presenting such a program to many in Asia through The Far East Broadcasting Company.
